RANCOCAS NATURE CENTER SUMMER CAMPS for grades 1 to 7

Full & half-day weekly sessions from Monday, June 27 to Friday, August 12

Summer camp at Rancocas is a fun way to add natural science knowledge to your child's education. Each week features a different theme. Three group levels give campers an age-appropriate experience. Children are grouped by their grade as of September 2016. Entering Grades 1 to 2: *Nature Detectives*; Entering Grades 3 to 4: *Rancocas Rangers*; Entering Grades 5 to 7: *Jr. Naturalists*.

Week 1: June 27 – July 1, Critters and Creatures

Full-day camp: Mon.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm; Cost: \$240/week

From our microscopic critters to our resident White-tailed Deer, campers will become familiar with the animal species at Rancocas that live in our waterways, woodlands, and gardens.

Week 2: July 5 – July 8, Scales and Tails

Full-day camp: Tues.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm; Cost: \$195/week

Summertime is full of excitement on the trails as our native reptiles and amphibians are able to be found and observed. In addition, campers will have a first-hand experience with Rancocas' resident animals.

Week 3: July 11 – July 15, Habitat Detectives

Full-day camp: Mon.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm; Cost: \$240/week

Exploring the Rancocas Center grounds is especially fun in the summer when all animal groups are up and about, searching for their next meal, and having young.

Week 4: July 19 – July 22, Wildlife Investigations

Half-day camp: Tues.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm; Cost: \$120/week

This fun week will expose campers to all that makes Rancocas a special place—the plants and animals that live in the park and the best spots to find them.

Week 5: July 26 – July 29, Animal Explorations

Half-day camp: Tues.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm; Cost: \$120/week

Campers will search the preserve for animal life of all kinds—from the invertebrate groups to the awesome number of wildlife that live in Rancocas' meadows, forests, and streams.

Week 6: August 1 – August 5, Who's Who on the Trails

Full-day camp: Mon.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm; Cost: \$240/week

As campers investigate the Rancocas habitats, they'll see what they can discover along the trails—who lives where and who's hiding here. There are always signs of wildlife wherever we look.

Week 7: August 9 – August 12, Survival in the Wild

Half-day camp: Tues.- Fri. from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm, Cost: \$120/week

What does it takes to survive in the wild? How are animals and plants protected from predators? Campers will use their imaginations as they look for answers and try fun strategies on the trails while becoming familiar with our wildlife preserve.

FINDING FUNGI AT RANCOCAS

Sunday, July 10, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Join the NJ Mycological Association (NJMA) on a walk to discover the variety of fungi found at Rancocas. Bracket fungi, typical mushrooms, jellies, cups and corals are some of the many groups to be seen. Collected specimens will be identified by NJMA members. The afternoon will feature a mushroom cultivation demonstration, and offer those interested the chance to make their own "mushroom habitat" (additional cost, \$6 each). Pre-registration required. Program cost: RNC members, \$7/person, \$15/family (limit 5); nonmembers, \$9/person, \$21/family (limit 5).

4th ANNUAL RANCOCAS GARDEN DAY OPEN HOUSE

Sunday, August 7, 12:00 to 4:00 p.m.

The Rancocas gardens will be at their peak in August. Intended as educational displays as well as wildlife-friendly habitats, the gardens are an exciting blend of different themes that can easily be adapted to your backyard. Join Master Gardeners and Rancocas staff for an afternoon of visual ideas. Stations with educational handouts will be set up at each of the Rancocas managed areas. Take a guided tour of the Pollinator/Wildlife Garden, the Rancocas Historical Garden, the Dragonfly Pond, and the Monarch Waystation, or a self-guided walk and learn about the different habitats. Knowledgeable gardeners will be available to answer your questions. Cost: Free, donations accepted and appreciated.
