



DIRECTIONS TO THE RANCOCAS NATURE CENTER:

FROM I-295: Exit 45A (Mt. Holly/Willingboro exit). Head east on Rancocas Road. The Center is on the right-hand side, about 1.8 miles from I-295.

FROM STATE ROUTE 206: Connect with Route 38 southeast of Mount Holly. Take Route 38 west to Route 541 By-pass, turn right, following Route 541 to Rancocas Road (2nd intersection). Turn left onto Rancocas Road and proceed about 1 mile. The Center will be on the left.

Childhood and the outdoors are a natural fit. At Rancocas Nature Center Summer Day Camp, campers get to explore the preserve's varied habitats, and might spend the day investigating a stream, chasing butterflies in the meadow, or discovering creatures under a log in the forest. These outdoor experiences are complemented by hands-on educational activities with a natural history focus. Children are led by staff members who are trained environmental educators, and small group sizes ensure that each child has a unique summer experience.

ENTERING GRADES 1 TO 2 NATURE DETECTIVES
